- **T:** Downward pick (thumb)
- **D:** Downstroke (index finger)
- **U:** Upstroke (middle finger)

The alternating downstrokes and upstrokes form the backbone of the clawhammer pattern. Practice slowly and gradually increase the speed as you become more comfortable.

Hammer-ons and pull-offs add melodic embellishments to clawhammer ukulele playing.
